Student Support enhance the student experience for all students. Initiatives include new student orientation, academic and welfare support, one-on-one support and many other resources.

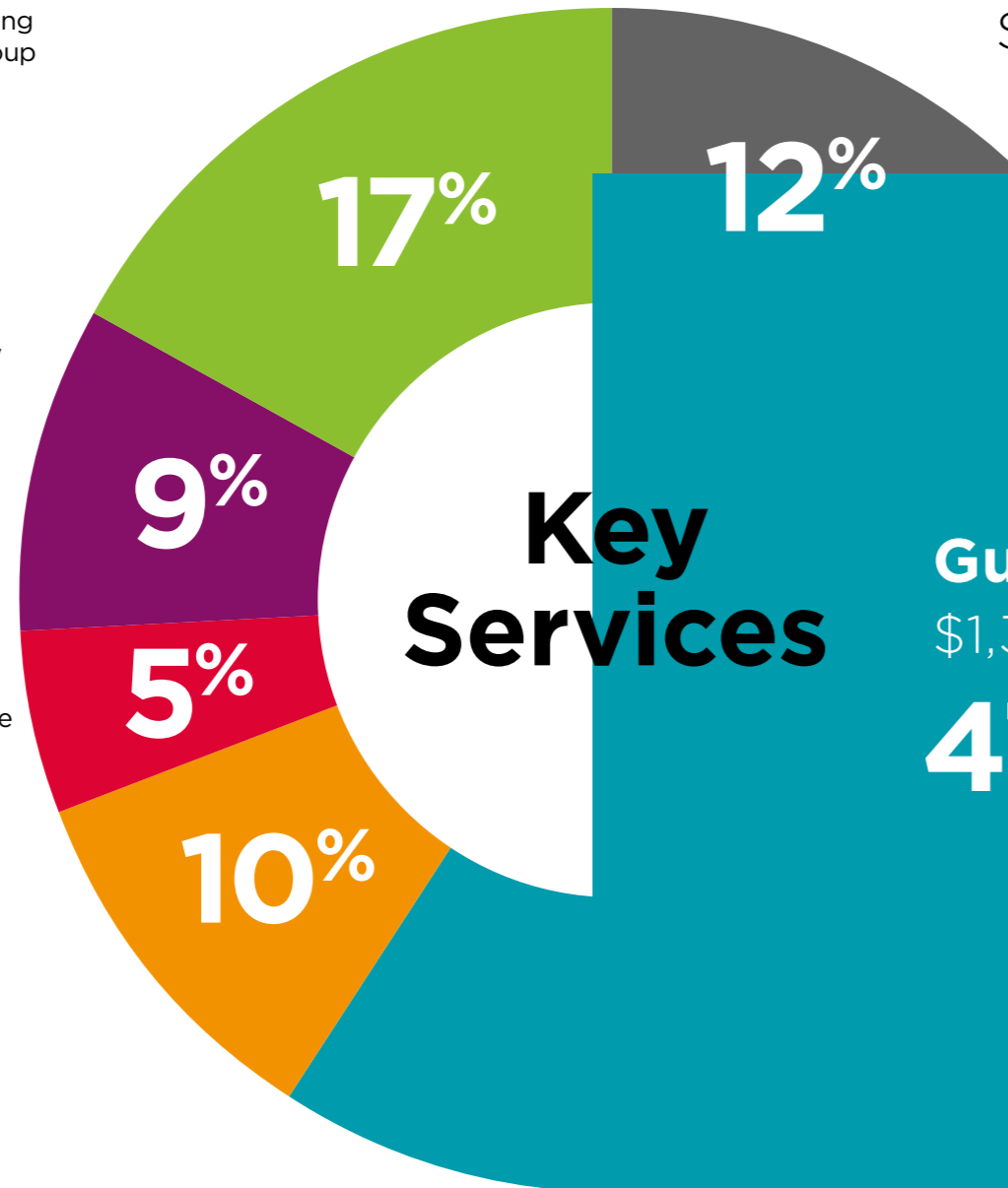
Sport & Recreation

\$355,950

Guild head office administrative support.

11% **Volunteering + Employability**
\$162,739

Volunteering Hub and MSEL program.

10% **Representation**
\$154,708

3% **Cafe + Food services**
\$40,000

After hours café availability.

3% **Metior and Diary**
\$48,599
